John Layard, Vera Von der Heydt and Victor White are three significant figures in the early days of analytical psychology during the first half of the 20th century. They individually came to know Jung and subsequently each other as their spiritual lives interacted with their psychological development. The therapeutic practice of Layard in Oxford, which Victor White experienced owes much to Homer Lane, another early therapist. It is this inheritance together with the insight and teaching of Vera von der Heydt, which illustrates Jung's acknowledgment and respect for a personal spirituality on the inner journey. Illustrated by material from the John Layard archives and performed by members of the Guild of Analytical Psychology and Spirituality, the evening will present unpublished letters, writings and drawings. It is hoped to involve the collective memory of these key individuals by those attending the lecture.

A graduate of GAPS, **Martin Knops** studied in the 1970's at Blackfriars, Oxford, the home of Victor White OP, a decade earlier. He was later taught by Vera von der Heydt and is currently researching the influence of her friend John Layard on the practice of analytical psychology. Having taught Religious Studies both in secondary education and to adults, Martin Knops was a broadcaster on radio and television. For the past twenty-five years he has provided international psychosocial support for Oxfam GB and is a tutor on humanitarian studies at Brookes University, Oxford. His practice as a Jungian therapist is in North Oxfordshire where he lives with his family.
